Wardens Words – from Liz and George

We had a lively and productive PCC meeting on Monday with the new Rural Dean, Michael Ridley, in attendance to offer support and advice. The first decision we took was to agree that Derek should invite nominations for the four posts which are unfilled at the moment. This is a year when there will be some significant decisions to take so we want representation of the congregation to be as wide as possible.

Progress on filling the vacancy was of course at the heart of the meeting. We must produce a 'Parish Profile' which is a form of prospectus for those who might be interested in applying to be our rector. Tim Morris and Jill Wasey have produced an excellent first draft on which PCC members will offer comments by the end of the month. After that we want your involvement to make sure we have the best possible document. We are particularly keen on your thoughts about how to describe our aspirations. How to do that?

Our decision is to make a draft available to all on the electoral roll and to invite discussion on it and on other aspects of the vacancy at our Harvest Supper, which Vanessa has kindly agreed to arrange on **Friday 17**th **October** at Lymm Golf Club as usual. For anyone who is not at that event we will organise another informal gathering and also invite comments by email. Our next PCC meeting is on 10th November, and we hope to be able to sign off a near final version then.

There is no further news from the Diocese about any possible link with St Peter's. As soon as we have something we shall let you know.

The installation of our new Audio-Visual system is going well. It should be in place by early October, but then we need to learn to exploit its potential. Do you know anyone who might like to help?

Access to the Cenotaph is likely to be further delayed as there are apparently concerns about the positioning of the support pylons. We agreed that Derek should write to Warrington BC to see if there is a way to secure safe access for Remembrance Sunday.

Cleaning was another topic for discussion. We agreed to pursue acceptance of the services of a cleaner for the Hall but there were mixed views on whether we should take on cleaning of the Church ourselves. We agreed that after the annual Big Clean we would assess whether there were enough people willing and able to make that work. Please sign up for the Big Clean when the date is announced and let us know your views then.

The report on our finances is a cause for concern. While we have reserves for capital projects our current income and expenditure show us to be in deficit. Kath Buckley has some great ideas for fundraising and recent events on which she has led have been great in raising our profile. Huge thanks to her, Tim Old and the team for the Open Garden Day. Now we all need to support Heritage Weekend and help Kath to develop some of her other ideas.

The Rural Dean ended our meeting by congratulating us on the way we were keeping things going and encouraging us to put the heat on in Church regardless of the cost!

Planned regular giving

Many members of our congregation support the church finances by giving monthly by standing order. Regular giving helps us to budget for the year, and when gift aided, helps us to reclaim a significant amount from HMRC at the end of the year. Green Tips: Use your freezer to prevent food waste

You can freeze pretty much anything, to preserve nutrients as much as to prevent waste. Freeze food before its use-by date, and make sure it's packed in airtight bags or freezer-proof containers to avoid freezer burn. Freeze cheese in portions or grated for ease of use. Defrost food in the fridge overnight, to avoid the so-called danger zone, because bacteria can form above 8C. Once defrosted, it's a good general rule to eat it within 24 hours, and don't refreeze unless it's been cooked since thawing.
