News about the collapsed church wall repairs

We are pleased to confirm that we have had a communication from Warrington Borough Council about progress with the rebuilding of the collapsed wall at the edge of the churchyard. They have assured us that access to the Cenotaph Memorial will be available for this year's Remembrance Sunday Service. The work on the pathway down to the War Memorial is complete. The only aspect that has yet to be completed are the blocks and concrete that will be positioned between the exposed buttress posts and the rebuilt perimeter wall. When this is done, the buttresses will be loadbearing and the wall supported by them. This work will be addressed in the next few weeks. When all this is completed the lower part of the churchyard will be reopened including the route to the War Memorial.

There will be work after Remembrance Sunday on the other side of the churchyard wall, but this will not affect access to the lower churchyard. We will also see another small compound located in the car park while this work is going on until all the works has finally finished.
