Wardens' Words – update from our Churchwardens

PCC membership At our meeting on Monday, 3 November, the PCC were pleased to be accept three nominations to fill vacancies. We welcome Alexia Hine, Janet Morris and Carol Roberts. We want to encourage others to join next year; anyone standing has to have been on the Electoral Roll for at least 6 months. We must hold the Annual Parochial Church meeting before 31 May so if you are not yet on the Electoral Roll, PLEASE put yourself on NOW. Remembrance Sunday We checked that everything was in hand for Remembrance Sunday and are looking forward to being able to allow some to go down the new path to the Cenotaph. **Vacancy** Progress in filling our vacancy is slow. We reported that Archdeacon Michael Gilbertson would come to talk to the PCC at its January meeting. Before that, we are hoping to have written proposals for future arrangements between the parishes of Oughtrington, Warburton and Lymm.

We agreed to arrange an Extraordinary Meeting of the PCC to discuss those and to look again at the Parish Profile in December. Comments on the Profile which have been received by then will be discussed and changes to the draft agreed – do keep the comments coming as they are really helpful.

Audio Visual system It is great to see the new AV system working - a project delivered on time and within budget thanks to a hard-working team (Simon has been amazing). Feedback as we learn to exploit the potential of the system would be great, and if you would like to help do let Simon know.

Repairs and improvements We agreed on two items of expenditure: new lighting for the chancel, which should be in place for Christmas and new covering for the Church Hall roof. We want to encourage use of the Hall. Kath Buckley and David Young are looking at how we can do that. If you have ideas do let them know.

Finally, we hope you are warm! George has set the thermostat on the church heating system to try to get the right balance of warmth and waste.

Community Christmas Tree Festival 2025 Friday 5th – Sunday 7th December 2025 Save the dates – we are going to need lots of help again. Sign-up sheets will be available immediately after Remembrance Sunday, but please keep some time free to help over the weekend. Donations of cakes for the café will also be requested. Don't forget to keep making items for our craft and produce stall please.

Green Tips – Choose an eco-friendly wrapping paper for your presents

Did you know that 100,000 miles of wrapping paper goes into landfill each year in the UK? We can do our bit by making sure that we buy recyclable wrapping paper for our gifts and recycle any paper we receive.



What is eco-friendly wrapping paper made of? If you buy recycled gift wrap, it's made of paper that was used already (like recycled newsprint or cardboard) and can be recycled yet again. Either one would be a greener option than traditional gift wrap. And there are even recyclable options that are made of different materials—such as plant fibres.

You can also buy paper Christmas tape to use instead of plastic sticky tape. This is a great website for sustainable Christmas items: https://smallkind.co.uk/collections/christmas-cards-wrapping

Which types of wrapping paper and related items can't be recycled?

As a rule, if when you scrunch up the paper, it springs back then it isn't recyclable.

You can't recycle:

Any sticky tape and decorations such as ribbons and bows Foil or glitter-decorated paper
