The 15 shortlisted entries will be on display at the back of church. The copies of the criteria that were given to schools will be there for you to look at.

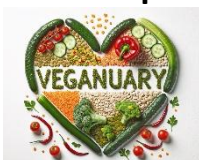

- Glass bottles and jars
- Plastic bottles - drinks bottles, household cleaner bottles, shampoo bottles etc
- Plastic food trays/tubs/pots e.g. margarine tubs, yogurt pots
- Newspapers and magazines
- Shredded paper
- Tetra pak drink cartons
- Food and drink tins and cans
- Tin foil, and clean foil trays
