Warden's Words – from Liz and George

Our PCC meeting on Monday began with a discussion with our Archdeacon, Michael Gilbertson and Rural Dean, Michael Ridley, about the future. While we made clear that we were open to any proposals to work with St Peter's and St Werburgh's we emphasised that we had, in effect, been without a Rector for a year and were keen to move forward with recruitment as fast as possible.

One of the issues has been that none of us has been paying our full parish share. Last year we paid about 60% of our share (£55,000). This year we are expected to pay the diocese £80,000. We have taken the decision, made possible by a generous recent legacy, to pay £70,000 now and to undertake to meet the full share within 3 years.

We thought carefully about this and are confident that with the energy and enthusiasm evident in St Mary's now, and with a new Rector to lead us, we can grow our church family. On that basis the Archdeacon will ask the Bishops to agree to our going ahead with recruitment. If the Bishops agree, it will still take us a while to complete the process, but we will progress as fast as we can and maybe we shall have a new Rector by the summer. We will keep you all updated.

Meet the Bishops

Bishops Mark and Julie are visiting our Great Budworth Deanery for two days in January and there will be an opportunity for members of our congregation to come and meet with them and to ask any questions they may have. This can be on our vacancy or any other matter they may wish to raise.

Bishops Mark and Julie will be attending a Q&A session on Tuesday 20th January at St James, Latchford between 7.00-8.30pm. There will be a short service first and this will be followed by the Q & A session and there will be some light refreshments.

All are welcome. If anyone cannot attend but would like to ask a question, please contact either Derek or Ian who will be able to pass the question on.

Heulwen Smith – funeral Friday 30th January at 11.30am.

It is with the greatest sadness that we have learned of the death of Heulwen Smith on Wednesday 7th January, just one day short of her 90th Birthday. She served St Mary's faithfully over many years, was Reader/Reader Emeritus and we give thanks for all she did to strengthen so many in their own journey of faith.

Her funeral will be at St Mary's on Friday 30th January at 11.30am following the committal at the crematorium.

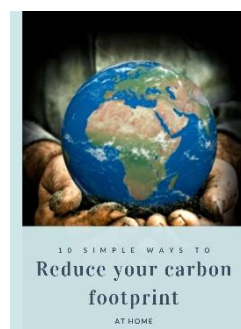
